I. Approval of November 18, 2014 minutes

c. Provost Review

On behalf of an inquiry that came from a faculty member, Jan asked University Governance when the university community will be informed about the outcome of the review of the Provost. She was informed that after a 5-year review, no information regarding the outcome of the review is released.

d. Social Media Policy

The committee discussed the topic of the Board of Regents Social Media Policy. The KU Social Media Policy committee, chaired by Jonathan Mayhew, will be presenting their proposed procedures for implementation of the policy that have been approved by SENEX at the December 4th

University Senate meeting. Nancy Kinnersley is on the committee and she stated that once approved, this policy will be a Provost's policy. After discussion, Jim made a motion and Nancy seconded, with unanimous approval, to request that our committee be allowed to review this policy prior to the vote on it by the University Senate.
